**THOUGHT FOR 17th SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (27/28th July):** The Lord's Prayer, taught to the disciples by Jesus, is not simply a formula. It is a model of how all our prayer should be. If God knows all our needs, even before we make our requests, then we should be confident that nothing we really need will be denied us when we call upon God. The thing is to know what we really need.




 **First Reading:** (Gen 18:20-32). Abraham intercedes with God on behalf of Sodom, a city full of evil.


 **Second Reading:** (Col 2:12-14). Through Baptism a Christian dies to the old sinful way of life, and rises to live a new life.


 **Gospel:** (Lk 11:1-13) Jesus urges the apostles to pray to God with child-like trust for all needs.

**THOUGHT FOR 18th Sunday of the Year (3rd/4th August):** Whether it's money in the bank or grain in the barn, we can all become so preoccupied with our financial situation that it prevents us from living. To be rich indeed is to know what is important to us in life. There are some things we never miss until they are gone. And usually these things have nothing to do with money.



 **First Reading:** (Eccles 1:2; 2:21-23). The things that are supposed to satisfy human beings do not satisfy them.

 **Second Reading:** (Col 3:1-5, 9-11). Through Baptism we share in the life of Christ. We hear some of the conclusions that follow from this.

 **Gospel:** (Lk 12:13-21). Jesus warns against greed, and stresses the foolishness of depending on material things for one's security rather than on God.
