

As the liturgical year draws to a close, the readings for this Sunday focus on end times, judgment, and the call to remain faithful. In the Gospel, Jesus foretells the destruction of the Temple and warns of coming trials—wars, natural disasters, and persecution. Yet, He also offers a promise: "By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

This message is not meant to instil fear, but to encourage hope and endurance. Jesus assures us that even in the midst of chaos, God is present, offering wisdom and strength to those who trust in Him. The first reading from Malachi speaks of a day of judgment, where the wicked will be consumed, but the righteous will experience healing and joy. The psalm invites us to sing praise to the Lord who rules with justice.

In the second reading, Paul urges the Thessalonians to live responsibly and avoid idleness. Faith is not passive—it is shown through daily commitment and action.

Today is perhaps time to reflect on how do I respond to uncertainty and fear in the world around me? Lord, in times of trouble and uncertainty, help me to remain steadfast in faith. Teach me to trust in Your presence and to persevere with hope. May I live each day with love, courage, and the assurance that You walk with me. Amen.
