The Solemnity of Christ the King marks the end of the liturgical year and reminds us that Jesus is not a king like earthly rulers. His kingdom is founded on love, truth, and peace, not power or domination. In Luke, Jesus on the cross is mocked as "King of the Jews," yet reveals his kingship through mercy and self-giving love. He forgives his executioners and promises paradise to the repentant thief. This paradox shows that true power is service and

sacrificial love. To reign with Christ means to serve others, especially the poor and suffering. The good thief's plea— "Jesus, remember me"—and Christ's response— "Today you will be with me in paradise"—show that his kingdom is open to all who turn to him in faith. This is a kingdom of grace, not merit. To let Christ reign in our lives means surrendering pride, ambition, and self-obsession. It means loving God first and neighbour as ourselves, building a kingdom of justice and peace here and now. In what ways can I serve others as a sign of belonging to God's kingdom? Do I trust in Christ's mercy, even in moments of weakness or failure?

Lord, teach me to serve as you served, to forgive as you forgave, to trust as the good thief trusted. Let your love quide my steps, your truth shape my choices, and your peace fill my soul.
